The 2016/2017 exhibit features 28 unique sculptures demonstrating the community's continued commitment to the aesthetic and cultural enhancement of our downtown.

The project is annually supported by the Downtown Development Authority, the Thornapple Arts Council and direct financial support by community donors. Nine of the sculptures are temporarily leased for 1-year from the Midwest Sculpture Initiative and Local Artist. Nineteen of the sculptures have been gifted to the City for permanent display.

A new feature this year was a story writing contest that was held in April. Middle and high school students in the area were asked to write a brief, fictional story about the sculpture "The Gatherer." The story and information about the author is featured in this brochure.

We hope you enjoy this free walkable outdoor exhibit that is displayed year-round and that you will continue to return to take in all of what our downtown has to offer.

Gong Pyramid 3

Artist: Beau Bilenki
South Bend, IN
Material: Cement and Steel
with Ceramic tile and plate mirror,
stainless steel gong and clapper
Weight: 800 lbs.

"The steel rebar is easy to transport, bend, cut and weld into an open form. These armatures become interior support. Wrapping the rebar frame with galvanized lath gives a transparent surface. When covered by hand with a spatula, the "textured skin" of common cement now becomes a solid-like surface and form, but still remains hollow. I may create, for function or effect, an open space, slit or hole that could assist in lifting the sculpture. The broken plate mirror and /or ceramic tile give life and accent to these quiet forms."



"In general I would characterize my work as being organic and minimalistic. Meditation on the curved line and expressing motion in a static sculpture constitute the major themes of my work. The potential of the single line or the undulating mixture of multiple curves to express emotions and relate to the natural world seems limitless. My work is intuitive and springs from a churning inside of me and from my observation of the natural world ~ a world that humans seem hell bent on subduing, an ultimate impossibility as the tides and rivers and twisted tree branches within each individual have an immutable claim on us."



Bruce Hathaway - The Seventh Tree

Growing up in Lindsey, Ohio, Bruce received his B.A. from Bowling Green State University in 1967. In his early artistic life, he worked with soldered steel and plaster on steel mesh frames. For some years, he put sculpture aside to find expression with the photographic medium. His photography has been exhibited in Connecticut, New York City and, extensively in Vermont. He has received two KINSA awards and a number of gallery exhibition awards.



Bruce's return to sculpture was prompted by a need to give expression to spatial vision and to realize abstracted and expressionistic compositions. He has been involved with the metal crafts for over thirty-five years during which time he has honed his metal working skills. Bruce lives with his wife and son in northern Vermont where he creates sculptures in his hilltop studio. His works are displayed in galleries and sculpture parks in Vermont, Massachusetts, Ohio and Michigan.

Pamela Reithmeier-Fowl Language and Summer Solstice

Pamela Reithmeier was born and raised in the Toledo, OH area. She has a Masters in Special Education from The University of Toledo and has retired after teaching for 34 years. Pam started sculpting in 2000. She has won various awards for her artwork. Her sculptures have been on display in galleries and juried shows throughout Ohio, Michigan, Tennessee, Indiana and Illinois. In addition, Pam has sculptures in private collections as well as a commissioned piece located at Fremont Middle School, Fremont, OH. Pamela uses both salvaged and new materials in her artwork. Tom Kaufmann - Kinderbells

A Michigan native, Tom grew up in Hastings, graduated from HHS in 1971 and worked as an afternoon disc jockey at WBCH while still in high school. He is an entertainer, wire sculptor, instrument builder and music educator. He began his career as a professional musician over thirty years ago at a night club in Osaka, Japan. Since that time, he has entertained audiences as a soloist and with a number of groups in the San Francisco area, on Florida's Gulf Coast, and throughout the Midwest. He has performed since 2001 at the top of the Historic Park Place Hotel



in Traverse City, Michigan. Recently, his creative efforts have focused on the construction of a series of unusual outdoor musical instruments like his lithophones and friction harp. His sound sculptures are featured at the Children's Garden at the Charlevoix Michigan Public Library, Petoskey Central Elementary School, Lansing Community College and at the Garoon Gateway to Science in Lake Zurich, Illinois. In 2009, he completed the Earth Tones Musical Garden at Raven Hill Discovery Center in East Jordan, Michigan. His Traveling Musical Instrument Petting Zoo is a hands-on learning experience that has delighted thousands of students of all ages, in schools, libraries, and museums throughout the region.

Within the past thirteen years, Mike's paintings and sculpture work has been published in news articles and numerous art publications, most noteworthy is inclusion of his park in four of the Sachiffer Publishing Collectors Editions, most recently Sculpture Reference (Illustrated) by Arthur Williams, 2005. Leichliter said such work goes hand-in-hand with what he does now. But before he started sculpting full-time, he owned an insurance business for about 20 years. He gave that up in 1993 and has been sculpting ever since.



Former owner and operator of "Moonshadow Home Designs" an artfully altered antique store and gallery which was located in the downtown area of Grand Rapids. He created mostly functional pieces of art for homes and businesses all over the state. The highlight of his career, thus far, was being a collaborator for "Imagine That" which took second place in the 2009 ArtPrize inaugural event and is currently still decorating the front of the Grand Rapids Children's Museum today.



Douglas Gruizenga - Trinity Doug received a Bachelor's Degree in Art Education from WMU as well as a Master of Arts in Art Practice. His major field of study was sculpture with a minor field study of furniture design. His primary emphasis at Western was in cast-welded metal sculpture. He assisted in the construction of much of the foundry equipment and coordinated pours of up to 2,200 pounds of sculpture in a single day. His most recent works have been included at several exhibitions including the 2012 ArtPrize at the B.O.B. in Grand Rapids, MI, Crystal Mountain Resort and Spa and Michigan Legacy Park in Thompsonville, MI, and the Spaces Biennial Sculpture Trail in Huntsville, AL which ran from 2012-2014.

Padnos does not sell his sculptures but occasionally contributes them for appropriate sites.

Troy Anderson, Steve's eldest son, has been working in the studio for eleven years. His two younger sons, Cory and Chad, have just begun their apprenticeships. sculpted from the finest copper and brass.

Downtown Sculpture Exhibit History

In 2009, as part of their creation of a Rest and Reflection Area behind City Hall, the Hastings Downtown Development Authority installed one sculpture on lease from Midwest Sculpture Initiative for a 6-month period. During that time, the sculpture was purchased by a member of the community and gifted back to the City of Hastings to be put on permanent display within the Downtown.

In 2010, the Downtown Development Authority expanded the outdoor art project to include 11 leased sculptures from Midwest Sculpture Initiative (MSI) and the first ever Downtown Sculpture Exhibit was created. Announcement of the pending exhibit created much interest within the community. The program was so well received that before the exhibit was installed, additional sculptures, separate from those leased through MSI were added to the show. By year end the exhibit consisted of 17 sculptures.

The sculpture exhibit continues to expand on a yearly basis, not only in the number of city-owned pieces, or size of the overall show, but also in the creation of infrastructure that permanently displays them. In particular, the purchase and donation of two pieces by the Decamp Family and the Employees of Flexfab LLC in 2010 and 2011 rippled into the full development of two sites for their display. "Avian Ascent" by Toni Lucadello is integrated into a rest area and planter/sculpture stand on the Hastings River Walk and within the Municipal Parking Lot #3, at the intersection of Michigan and Apple Street. "Radiolaria II" by John W. Parker is featured at the entrance of the Hastings Spray Plaza/Band Shell/Public Bathroom Facility next to the Hastings Goodrich Theater on West State Street which was completed in August 2013. The Spray Plaza, a \$450,000 project, was funded through approximately 85% private donation. The project was a direct result of the sculpture program, through its civic engagement and by an increased awareness of the power of arts, culture, and public infrastructure on our community's downtown health and vibrancy.

To date, the Community has been gifted 19 sculptures for permanent display. As part of the 2016 exhibit the DDA and a local business have leased 8 sculptures from

MSI, and one from a local artist which equals 28 in total on display this year. The exhibit again includes the mural "Movie Classics" by Adam Feldpausch painted in 1996.

The community support of the exhibit has been tremendous. A selection Committee of over 40 community members annually chooses the pieces for display. People from within and outside of the community praise the exhibit through casual conversation and written word. Community members have shared stories and pictures about relatives who have come to the City from outside of the region and State that are amazed by a community of our size hosting such an exhibit. Others have shared how relatives get together to stroll the downtown to see the works of art...for free. Funding agencies use the exhibit

as a benchmark of community success and have granted the City funding based on the "Place Making" efforts. Business professionals, real estate developers, marketers throughout the State and within the region as well as many community members view the installation of the sculptures for what they are...ART, A COMMUNITY and ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY....

Thank you for embracing and celebrating the exhibit's success with us. We hope you will return throughout the year to experience the exhibit, the Downtown and to explore Hastings on the Thornapple.
