July 7th- Out of Favor Boys

Conceived in Kalamazoo, Michigan in 2003, Out of Favor Boys have evolved into a blues staple in Southwest Michigan. They are one of Southwest Michigan's premier contemporary blues bands. Honored as Michigan's Best Blues band 2011, they've been the house band at two of Kalamazoo's



longest running blues jams at Wonderful's Funky Basement and The 411 Club for nearly 20 years. In addition to jamming with the best local, regional, and national musicians, hosting the jam session has given the band the opportunity to play with some national blues musicians like Tab Benoit, Watermelon Slim, and Robert Bradley.

The Thornapple Jazz Orchestra is comprised of community members and regional instrumentalists with an interest in performing music tethered in the big band jazz genre. TJO has a repertoire including vintage big band music as well as music of the contemporary big band. This full compliment

Drawing inspiration from some of the world's greatest rock and roll bands, and mixing pop sensibilities with spur of the moment musical creations into their own original alt. folk/blues rock sound, FlyLiteGemini is a band you'll remember long after the lights go out!

June 25th- Reverend Peyton's Big Damn Band

With all the power of a freight train, the Big Damn Band is known for its live shows. Rev. Peyton delivers guitar pyrotechnics the old fashioned way — ten fingers, a 6 string and an amp cranked at full tilt. In the country blues style, he plays the bass with his thumb, while picking the lead with his fingers at the same time. When he lifts the guitar behind his head to play there's nothing but skill and 16 gauge nickel strings to make the sounds coming out of the speakers.

Rev and his wife Breezy make their home in rural southern Indiana near the adopted home of bluegrass legend Bill Monroe, among national parks and forests in what began as an artist's colony. "Most of the people here can both paint a picture and skin a deer," laughs Breezy.

This is real, from the heart, handmade music made by people, for people who don't have time for BS.

Nothing has changed with time. After the passing of Tom Petty in October of 2017, front man Max Lockwood organized the band by pulling together some of his favorite musicians for a benefit concert. After a sold-out show that raised thousands for a local domestic violence shelter The Insiders decided they wouldn't back down. "We try to honor what Mr. Petty and the Heartbreakers have done for rock and roll each night. We're fans of the music foremost. These songs are woven into the fabric of the American identity."



They've found no shortage of demand, selling out shows everywhere they went in the first year of the band's existence. Local Spins' John Sinkevics had this to say: "The Insiders set the bar at a new level for Tom Petty tributes."

August 13th- The Army Band



The unit's headquarters is the 88th Reserve Support Command at Ft. Snelling, MN. The 338th is stationed at the 83rd Infantry Division Memorial US Army Reserve Center, Whitehall, Ohio suburb of Columbus) and in Livonia, Michigan. The 338th is currently made up of musicians

from every corner of Ohio, Michigan and parts of Kentucky. Members' ages range from 17 to 50+. They are always on the lookout for active duty musicians who are ending their enlistments and would like to finish their military careers in the Reserves. The 338th Army Band was originally formed in 1943 at Camp Siebert, Alabama as part of a support group for General Patton's 3rd Army in Europe.

August 20th- The Accidentals

Texas Lifestyle Magazine chose The Accidentals as the "band to see" at Austin City Limits, SXSW, calling them defiant, young – powerful, and undaunted." Female – fronted, multi-instrumentalist power trio, The Accidentals, (Sav Buist, Katie Larson, and Michael Dause) kicked off 2018 with the release of their debut album, Odyssey, with Sony Masterworks. They



followed the album release with two-hundred days of touring nationally, seventeen festivals, sync placement with Turner Classic Movies and FOX sports, and a RAM Trucks BANDvan #tourtough commercial. In 2019 they released a self-titled live album and a single with New West Records, and toured the UK. They scored an indie film, taught workshops across the country, and finished recording their much anticipated studio album, Vessel, co-produced by John Congleton (St. Vincent, Lana Del Ray) and Tucker Martine (Nico Case, Decemberists).

The goal: create and perform music that refreshes the soul! Crooked Root is Joe Ferguson, vocal/harmonica; Matt Landon, vocal/guitar; Eric Busch, percussion, and Billy LaValley, songwriter/bass.



5:45-7:00- Zion Lion



Zion Lion is the "baddest band to hit the Kalamazoo music scene." The members are a combination of several bands from the Kalamazoo area that crossed each others path along the way and decided to form the right mix of reggae, African zouk, mucosa, zoukous, and some Afro-Latin influences. 


