“The idea for Small Sounds started while I was teaching classes at The Looking Glass Preschool. I introduced Mr. Djembe (my African drum) to the kids one day. They had to ‘wake up’ the djembe before we could begin. Before long I was beating on the drum while they danced wildly around the room in rhythm. Seeing how much fun they were having I started to bring in my guitar and other instruments.”

The concept for Small Sounds was hatched; classes that were more than music theory, or rigid instruction. Music, movement and imagination became the motto. I wanted to create an experience where kids could be social, learn basic music principles all while having fun, moving around and getting to play hands-on with instruments and most of all using their imagination!

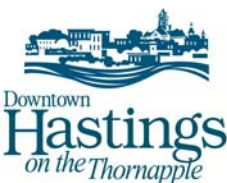

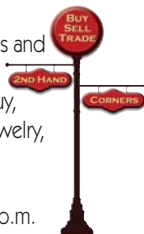
